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

We also had Sarah Hillman finishing as a top-10 senior lady, Adrienne Barthram 3rd FV40 with Samantha Grant, Sonia Pateman, Jen Nattrass & Louise Belbin all finishing in the top-10 too. Annalie Jane, Paula Farrell, Fiona Gibbs & Clare Wood were all top-10 in the FV50 category. Whilst Pauline Bradley finished top-10 FV60 & Rosemary Barber was 4th FV70.

Dan Jewell & Luke Stubbs were both in the top-10 men overall & 3rd & 4th Seniors respectively with Paul Dredge also in the top-10. Jay Hookins & Neil Gregory were top-10 in the MV40 category, Darren Messen was 3rd MV50, Andrew Trigg 2nd MV60 with Tim Burrell & Robin Mark top-10 also. Amazing running across the age categories.

"Goal Getters Challenge" – a non-time-based challenge where you earn points by engaging with AVR, AVT, and other running or multi-sport events through completing various challenges.


